DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLEGE

1.1. Objectives of the college

The aim of the Student Internship course is to enable students to deepen and expand their knowledge and skills acquired through theoretical and practical education in a traditional classroom setting. It involves familiarizing students with work processes and the operations of a specific organizational unit, working on concrete tasks under the supervision of a mentor within the organization, and preparing students for the job market. It also aims to connect students with potential future employers.

Certain knowledge and skills that students have acquired through the previous three semesters will be applied in 180 hours in one or more departments of the assigned organizational unit. The activities of the department in which the students do their internship must coincide with the outcomes of one or more completed courses. Students will perform the internship under the supervision of a mentor assigned by the internship provider, who will determine the content and dynamics of the performance, all in accordance with the learning outcomes of the Professional Practice course and the learning outcomes of the professional short study

Throughout the internship period, students are required to fill in a work diary, which is attached to the Professional Internship Report at the end. The key obligations of students include: INTERNSHIP COMPLETION: Internship is mandatory for full-time students for the duration specified in the curriculum of the short professional study program. During the internship, students must fulfill the following obligations: • Conscientiously perform tasks and duties during the internship. • Maintain a regular internship diary. Students are required to submit a Report on Completed Internship according to the provided template. PART-TIME STUDENTS: Part-time students employed under an employment contract may be exempt from completing the internship if their job description aligns with the study program and they are obligated to fill out relevant documentation. If the job description does not align with the study program, the employer may allow the student to complete the internship during working hours by undertaking other tasks according to organizational possibilities.
